Because of the current crisis in the country, there are now thousands of internally displaced people in the south east, a safe area of the country where the school is situated. We saw many refugee camps on our first visit in 2002 and we hope that once the elections have taken place, hopefully in December, the situation will improve.

On a more positive note, the children at the school are very happy. We have had messages from a student who is now in the sixth form and hoping to continue her studies at university. We are thinking about setting up bursaries for the students we have been sponsoring who are able to pursue their dream of further education.

Sister Rosine will have updated you about the arrival of 'Father Christmas' in Tshamalale. The container arrived at the Salesians' Headquarters where we had to take everything out for Customs. There were lots of things for the Salesians as well as other Congregations. We put the things in a hangar. After taking everything off, the lorry went to drop off the empty container at Tshamalale – you've seen the photo. The lorry then had to go back to Dar-es-Salaam.

Then we hired another lorry to get all our things to Tshamalale. There were more than 100 parcels muddled up. We put everything into a classroom and we're going to open them one by one, ticking off the items on your list. We have already contacted Ginny at CAM International to come and collect her parcels. We've already placed the tables in a classroom. They are beautiful and solid – thank you so much. We realise that you had a lot of work filling the boxes and labelling them.

I am so happy to write to you to say hello and to thank you sincerely. Really, I do not know how to express my gratitude. Yesterday I received a telephone call from my co-sister in Lubumbashi telling me that the container had arrived and that you have sent us 10 sewing machines and 5 wood working machines. I haven't yet seen them but I can assure you that I cannot express my joy.

Yesterday I could hardly sleep because of it. Thank you, thank you, thank you! May God shower you with blessings. You are children of God. No one could do this without God's help. This gives me hope of one day getting a van for our centre: the St Joseph's Centre of Literacy, Sewing and Woodwork.
